For Excellence in the Study of New Religious Movements with Ties to South Asia

The co-general editors of *Nova Religio* are pleased to announce the winner of the Fourth Helen Crovetto Award for Excellence in the Study of New Religious Movements with Ties to South Asia. The award was established in 2010 by Helen Crovetto to encourage research and articles on new religions that originate in South Asia, as well as on new religious movements that were inspired in part or whole by religions from South Asia.

The winner was selected by Hugh Urban and Andrea Jain, members of *Nova Religio*'s editorial board, and Scott Lowe and Catherine Wessinger, co-general editors, from articles appearing in volume 19 of the journal.

Peter Heehs will receive an award of \$300 for his article, "Sri Aurobindo and his Ashram, 1910–2010: An Unfinished History," *Nova Religio* 19, no. 1 (August 2015).

We thank Helen Crovetto for her generosity in providing the opportunity to encourage and reward authors for exceptional articles on new religious movements with ties to South Asia. We look forward to recognizing outstanding work in this area in the future.
