Manuscript Submission Guidelines

We invite English-language submissions of original research in the field of alternative/emergent/new religious movements and communities. Submissions are invited across disciplines and cultures. The preferred length of articles is between 6000–8000 words, or 24–28 pages of 250 words each. Submission of photographs (high contrast black and white are preferred) or other graphics is encouraged when they can substantively enhance an article. We reserve the right to edit for usage and style, and all accepted manuscripts are subject to editorial modification, with permission of author. Accepted manuscripts must follow the *Chicago Manual of Style* (14th ed., rev., sections 15.1 to 15.426) and must be submitted according to these style guidelines. All references should be in endnotes, numbered throughout the manuscript with the auto-numbering feature of the word processor. The journal encourages the use of nonexclusive language. Submissions accepted for publication will receive 10 tear sheets and two free copies of the issue in which the article appears. Although articles from specialists and established scholars are preferred, articles of superior quality from graduate students are welcome. All manuscripts submitted to *Nova Religio* should not have been published elsewhere and should not be under consideration for possible publication elsewhere without the consent and approval of the Co-General Editors and Publisher. Contributors should submit articles as email attachments in either Microsoft Word or Rich Text Format and send to Catherine Wessinger at novarel@loyno.edu. Contributors may also send 3.5-inch floppy disk or a CD that contains the article in either Microsoft Word or Rich Text Format to Dr. Wessinger. Disks will not be returned. Please send a one-page *c.v.* or a short biographical sketch with your paper. The author's name—which will be deleted for peer review—should appear only on the first page. Each article will be refereed by at least three specialists in the article's subject area, and will be evaluated by the three co-general editors.
